## **PREFACE**

We offer praise and gratitude to God Almighty for completing this guidebook for new student admission for 2023. This guidebook is published as a reference for implementing new student admissions at Universitas Negeri Surabaya (Unesa), especially on the independent path.

As one of the universities that develops society, especially in education, Unesa continues to be committed to maintaining the quality of human resources, including students. One of the initial gates to preserving the quality of human resources is the admission of new students. Therefore, Unesa issued new student admission guidelines that guide the implementation of new student admissions. In its development through independent learning, new student admissions are no longer like in the past, where students could only choose majors that are in line with majors in high school, but now participants can choose cross majors that are different from majors when in high school.

Guidelines are needed to facilitate the implementation of new student admissions, especially on independent pathways. Preparing the independent pathway new student admission guidebook is based on government regulations, especially the Minister of Education, Culture, Research and Technology regulation number 48 of 2022. Through this guidebook, the new student admission process can be carried out well, and it can develop further in the future.

Considering the rapid development of educational issues in Indonesia and the impact on new student admission policies at Universitas Negeri Surabaya, this guideline may still undergo revision in the next edition. Input from parties involved in implementing new student admissions at Universitas Negeri Surabaya will be eagerly awaited to refine these guidelines and further improve the quality of education at Universitas Negeri Surabaya.

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# CHAPTER I

## INTRODUCTION

### A. Background

Public interest in developing the quality of human resources makes universities must be ready to continue to improve the quality of education. Modern society is no longer blind to the quality of education, especially at the higher education level. People will choose which universities have good quality and which have poor quality. The quality of higher education is seen in how students contribute to society. The process of improving the quality of students begins with the admission of new students.

Changes to the selection for new student admissions (SPMB) through the Regulation of the Minister of Education, Culture, Research and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia Number 48 of 2022 concerning Admission of New Students for Diploma Programs and Undergraduate Programs at State Universities has an impact on changes in the acceptance of new students, including those held independently by universities. Apart from that, with the development of the concept of independent learning, which was conceptualized by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, the process of accepting new students, especially in selecting study programs, is no longer a limitation, where students can choose majors that are not following their majors in secondary education. This means that universities must also be able to adapt in implementing a new student admission system.

In addition, the Ministry of Education, Culture, Research and Technology has several new policies in new student admissions. Some of the new rules set by the ministry are 1) the implementation of independent pathways by universities which are carried out at the maximum in July, 2) notification to the public about the procedures for admitting new students and their assessment before the implementation of new student admissions, 3) notification to the public about the number of selection participants and the remaining quota and refutation of selection results. In addition, changes in global demands regarding the quality of human resources require universities to carry out the selection process for new student admissions competitively and with quality screening.

Universitas Negeri Surabaya organizes new student admissions through 3 main channels, namely non-test channels, achievement channels, and computer-based unesa entrance tests (TMUBK). Universitas Negeri Surabaya is committed to continuously improving the quality of new student admissions by adjusting to government policies. Based on this commitment, issuing a Guidebook for the Implementation of New Student Admission for Independent Pathways at Surabaya State University is necessary.

### B. GOALS

This guidebook aims to guide in accepting new students following established standard provisions and procedures. This guideline is also intended to ensure that the selection process for new student admissions can filter out qualified prospective students who can be competitive.

### **C. Basis of Preparation**

The basis for preparing guidelines for implementing online learning is:

1. Law no. 20 of 2003 concerning the National Education System.
2. Law no. 12 of 2012 concerning Higher Education.
3. Regulation of Minister of Education and Culture Regulation No. 3 of 2020 concerning National Higher Education Standards.
4. Regulation of Ministry of Education and Culture No. 5 of 2020 concerning Emancipatory Learning Program.
5. Regulation of Minister of Education and Culture Regulation No. 7 of 2020 concerning the Establishment, Changes, Dissolution of State Universities, and the Establishment, Changes, and Revocation of Private Higher Education Licenses
6. Regulation of the Minister of Education, Culture, Research and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia Number 48 of 2022 concerning Admission of New Students for Diploma and Undergraduate Programs at State Universities

## CHAPTER II

### TYPES OF PATHWAYS, REQUIREMENTS, AND REGISTRATION PROCESS

#### A. Independent New Student Admission Selection Pathway

In general, the new independent student admission pathway consists of 3 pathways, namely non-test pathways, achievement pathways, and test pathways. But specifically, the new student admission pathway consists of:

1. Non-test SNBP/Raport Test Pathway

Non-test SNBP/Raport Test Pathway is a selection path organized independently by Unesa by assessing participants' report cards and achievements. In addition, portfolio assessments are carried out for participants specifically for sports and arts study programs.

2. UTBK Non-Test Pathway

UTBK Non-Test Pathway is a selection path organized independently by Unesa by considering the UTBK scores of participants. UTBK scores are prioritized according to the study program chosen by the student.

3. Achievement Pathway

The Achievement Path is a selection path organized independently by Unesa which is devoted to students who have achievements at the district, provincial, national and international levels. Achievements do not have to be in the form of championships, but can also be in the form of participation. Especially for religious achievements, achievements are measured by the participant's religious understanding. Selection for this pathway is through a written test and a skills test.

4. Computer-Based Unesa Entrance Test Pathway (TMUBK)

The TMUBK pathway is a selection pathway organized independently by Unesa where participants work on questions prepared by the Unesa question compiler team. This TMUBK pathway is carried out through a computer-based written test, both online and offline.

5. Disability Pathway

The Disability Pathway is a selection pathway organized independently by Unesa which is specifically for participants who have limitations or are commonly referred to as Children with Special Needs (ABK). Selection is done through written tests and interviews

6. Magetan Special TMUBK Pathway

The Magetan Special TMUBK Pathway is a selection pathway held independently by Unesa specifically for study programs located on the Magetan satellite campus. Selection is done through a computer-based written test both online and offline.

7. Affirmation Pathway

The Affirmation Pathway is a selection pathway organized based on recommendations from the ministry to accommodate students who are in the 3T area. Selection of the affirmation pathway is adjusted to the policies of the ministry.

8. Collaboration Pathway

The Collaboration Pathway is a selection pathway organized independently by

Unesa which is based on a collaboration process between Unesa and Partners. Selection is carried out in accordance with the agreement between Unesa and partners as stated in the cooperation memorandum.

9. International/Overseas Pathway

The Overseas Pathway is a selection pathway organized independently by Unesa specifically for foreign students or Indonesian students who want to take international classes. Selection is made through computer-based written tests and other tests according to the needs of the students.

10. Transfer Pathway

The Transfer Pathway is a selection pathway organized independently by Unesa specifically for diploma students who want to transfer to the undergraduate pathway. Selection is done through a computer-based written.

## **B. NEW STUDENT ADMISSION REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS**

In general, the requirements for participants in new student admissions are

1. Indonesian Citizens for all pathways or Foreign Citizens for Overseas Pathways
2. High School / Equivalent

Meanwhile, specifically, the requirements for applicants are in accordance with each pathway.

1. Non-Test SNBP/Raport Pathway
  - a. High school graduates / equivalent in 2023
  - b. Having report cards from semester 1-4
  - c. It is recommended to have achievements according to the study program.
  - d. Participants who choose sports and arts study programs, must upload a portfolio
2. Non-test UTBK pathway
  - a. High school graduate/equivalent in 2023
  - b. UTBK SNBT participant and having a UTBK participant number
  - c. Participants who choose sports and arts study programs must upload a portfolio
3. Sports Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having achievements in the field of sports as proven by a sports championship certificate 1, 2, or 3 at the district/provincial/national/international level
4. Art Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having achievements in the arts at district, provincial, national and international levels



5. Islamic Boarding School Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Students from Islamic boarding schools and/or madrasas
  - c. Having a letter of recommendation from a credible religious institution
6. Tahfidz Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having memorized at least 10 chapters of the Koran
  - c. Having a letter of recommendation from a credible religious institution
7. MTQ Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Have achievements in the MTQ field at district, provincial, national and international levels
  - c. Have a letter of recommendation from a credible religious institution
8. Christian, Catholic, Hindu, Buddhist and Confucian Religious Achievement Pathways
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having a good understanding of religion and religious scriptures
  - c. Having a letter of recommendation from a credible religious institution
9. Science, Technology and Social Sciences Achievement Pathway (Academic)
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having championship achievements in the fields of science, technology and social science at district, provincial, national and international levels
10. Leadership Achievement Pathway
  - a. High school graduate/equivalent in 2023
  - b. Experiencing to be a student council president, deputy student council president, student council secretary, deputy student council secretary, student council treasurer, and deputy student council treasurer/similar
11. Computer-Based Unesa Entrance Test Route (TMUBK)
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Participants who choose sports and arts study programs must upload a portfolio
12. Disability Pathway
  - a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
  - b. Having a certificate of disability
  - c. Participants who choose sports and arts study programs must upload a portfolio
  - d. Having achievements in the arts at district, provincial, national and

international levels

13. Magetan Special TMUBK Pathway

- a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
- b. Participants who choose sports and arts study programs must upload a portfolio
- c. Willing to be placed on the Magetan Campus and follow the established lecture procedures

14. Affirmation Pathway

- a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
- b. Having an ID card that shows you come from 3T or have a certificate regarding your parents' employment as migrant workers

15. Cooperation Pathway

- a. High school graduate/equivalent in accordance with the memorandum of cooperation
- b. There is a memorandum of cooperation between Unesa and Partners

16. Overseas/International Pathway

- a. High school graduates/equivalent in 2021, 2022, and 2023
- b. Having good English language skills

17. Transfer Pathway

- a. Diploma graduates in 2021, 2022, and 2023
- b. Submitting a diploma or transcript

### **C. NEW STUDENT ADMISSION PROCESS**

The new student admission process consists of 7 stages of the process, namely:

1. Independent PMB participant registration,
2. Selection process,
3. Announcement of selection results,
4. Refutation of selection results,
5. Announcement of post-refutation results,
6. Re-registration, and
7. announcement and payment of UKT and SPI

## CHAPTER III

### DETERMINATION OF QUOTA FOR EACH STUDY PROGRAM

#### A. DETERMINATION OF QUOTA

In determining the quota for new students who will be accepted into each study program, the Sub-Directorate of Student Admissions and Graduation determines the student quota for each study program by considering the number of lecturers in each study program, as well as the facilities and infrastructure, especially facilities related to learning in each study program. With the development of learning implementation, which is not only carried out offline but can also be carried out online, the calculation of the need for facilities and infrastructure no longer considers the facilities and infrastructure for lectures on theoretical concepts but the facilities and infrastructure that are more considered are the facilities and infrastructure for practice-based learning.

After the analysis, the Sub Directorate of Student Admissions and Graduation reports the results to the Academic Director and Deputy Rector 1 for Academic and Student Affairs. The report's results were followed up by inviting all faculty leaders to set the quota together. In 2023, the overall quota details are SNBP = 22%, SNBT = 45%, and SPMB = 33%

#### B. QUOTA FOR EACH STUDY PROGRAM

Based on the results of the Sub-Directorate of Admissions and Graduation meeting with Unesa and Faculty leaders, in 2023 a quota for student admissions in each pathway will be determined. The acceptance quota for each study program in each pathway is determined by looking at applicants in the previous year in each pathway and study program. The quota on the independent pathway is announced to the public via the page [admisi.unesa.ac.id](http://admisi.unesa.ac.id). The distribution of quotas for new study program students in each pathway is as follows.

## CHAPTER IV

### REGISTRATION PROCEDURES AND FINANCING

#### A. REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

1. Prospective participants create a registration account first via the [pmb.unesa.ac.id](http://pmb.unesa.ac.id) page and select the "Registration" menu.
2. Prospective Participants then receive a registration account verification email
3. Prospective participants are expected to validate their account and create a password
4. If the email does not arrive in the inbox, prospective participants can look at spam city
5. Prospective participants then open the [pmb.unesa.ac.id](http://pmb.unesa.ac.id) page and select "Login" using the new email and password to fill in their biodata, path and chosen study program and upload all required document files.
6. If all columns and files have been fulfilled, prospective participants can lock their registration data
7. Prospective participants will get a virtual account number and pay the registration fee via Partner Bank. Payment can be made via M-Banking via virtual account transfer
8. Prospective participants then print a registration card via their registration account
9. Check or reprint the registration card 2 (two) days before the test schedule
10. Participants upload data:
  - a. Scan of diploma or graduation certificate
  - b. Scan of proof of the championship in accordance with the special requirements of the achievement track
  - c. Scan of report cards for semesters 1-4 specifically for the non-SNBP/report card test route
  - d. Scan of recommendation letter from a valid religious institution
  - e. Color photo file in JPEG or PNG format with plain background, maximum size 100 kb, dimensions 400 x 600 pixels (4x6 cm)

#### B. REGISTRATION FEE AND PAYMENT METHOD

The registration fee is IDR 300,000 (three hundred thousand rupiah) for a choice of one study program and IDR 400,000 (four hundred thousand rupiah) for a choice of two study programs. Payment is made via Bank/ATM via virtual account. The method for paying these fees is as follows:

1. BTN Mobile Banking
  - a. Login to m-Banking
  - b. Select the "Payment" menu
  - c. Input VA Number

- d. Input m-Banking PIN

## 2. BTN ATMs

- a. Select "Other Transactions"
- b. Select "Payment"
- c. Select "Multipayment"
- d. Select "Virtual Accounts"
- e. Input VA Number
- f. Make sure the data is correct, then select "Correct"
- g. Print Receipt

## 3. Other Bank ATMs

- a. Select "Other Transactions"
- b. Select "Transfer"
- c. Select "Other Bank Account"
- d. Enter the BTN Bank Code (200) followed by the VA Number. Example  
2009462110010713119212
- e. Input the bill amount then select "Correct"
- f. Make sure the data listed is your name then select "Yes"
- g. Continue confirming until the receipt comes out of the ATM machine

## 4. BTN teller

- a. Give the VA Number to the nearest BTN Teller
- b. The teller will inform you of the amount to be paid
- c. Hand over the money to the Teller according to the nominal bill
- d. Receive and save payment receipts from Tellers

## CHAPTER V

### SELECTION, ASSESSMENT, AND GRADUATION PROCESS

#### A. SELECTION PROCESS AND MATERIALS

##### 1. SNBP/Raport Non-Test Pathway

- a. The selection process for the SNBP/Raport non-test pathway is based on the participant's report card scores
- b. The selection material is the IP value of the report card each semester, the value of special subjects in accordance with the study program, school accreditation, achievements, and portfolios
- c. The components of special subjects are Mathematics and English.
- d. The average value of report cards and special subjects is taken from semester 1, 2, 3, and 4.
- e. The formulation of the final score of a participant's graduation is:
  - 1) Sports and arts study programs that require a portfolio:
$$NA = 0.5 * RP + 0.5 * (0.1 * AK + 0.2 * MK + 0.2 * SR + 0.5 * PT) + 5 * SPI \text{ level}$$
  - 2) Non-portfolio study program
$$NA = 0.5 * RP + 0.5 * (0.1 * AK + 0.5 * MK + 0.4 * SR)$$

##### Description

NA = Final Grade

RP = Average report card of semester 1, 2, 3, and 4 AK = School accreditation score

MK = average score of special subjects in semesters 1, 2, 3, and 4 SR = Achievement score or certificate

PT = portfolio value

##### 2. UTBK Non-Test Pathway

- a. The selection material for the UTBK non-test pathway is based on the national UTBK score
- b. Determination of graduation from the UTBK non-test pathway is carried out by sorting the scores starting from the highest score to the lowest score according to the participant's choice of study program
- c. The order of participants who pass is based on the quota or quota of each study program in the UTBK non-test pathway
- d. The Final Score of passing participants is:.
$$NA = \text{SNPMB score} + 5 * \text{SPI level}$$

##### Information

After getting the SNBT test number of all participants, WR 1 writes to the SNPMB central committee to get the final UTBK score.

### 3. Sports Achievement Pathway

- a. The test on the sports achievement pathway selection consists of a written test and a skills test
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The skill test material is a test of ability in the field of sports in accordance with the sports achievements possessed
- d. The Final Score formula for passing participants is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Description

NA = Final Score

TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

### 4. Art Achievement Pathway

- a. The test on the art achievement pathway selection consists of a written test and a skills test
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The material of the skills test is a test of ability in the field of art in accordance with the artistic achievements possessed
- d. The Final Score formula for passing participants is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Information

NA = Final Score TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

### 5. Islamic Boarding School Achievement Pathway

- a. The test in the Islamic boarding school achievement pathway selection consists of a written test and a skills test.
- b. Written test materials consist of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The skill test material is an Islamic religious understanding test, a reading and interpretation test of the yellow book, a nahwu/sorrof test, and a book explanation test.
- e. The formula for the Final Score of the participant's graduation is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Information

NA = Final Score

TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 6. Tahfidz Achievement Path

- a. The test in the tahfidz achievement path selection consists of a written test and a skills test.
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The material of the skills test is a test of memorizing the Koran according to the juz mastered
- f. The Final Score formula for passing participants is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Information

NA = Final Score TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 7. MTQ Achievement Path

- a. The test in the MTQ achievement path selection consists of a written test and a skills test
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The skill test material is an MTQ practice test in accordance with the type of MTQ that is won and mastered
- g. The formula for the Final Score of a participant's graduation is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Description

NA = Final Score

TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 8. Christian, Catholic, Hindu, Buddhist, and Confucian Religious Achievement Paths

- a. The test in the non-Muslim achievement path selection consists of a written test and a skills test.
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The material of the skills test is an understanding test related to religion and the holy book of his religion
- h. The Final Score formula for passing participants is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

NA = Final Score

TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 9. Achievement Pathway for Science and Technology (Academic)

- a. The test in the selection of the Science and Social Achievement Pathway consists of a written test and a skills test.
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The skill test material is a test of understanding and / or skills related to the scientific and social science achievements obtained
- d. The formula for the Final Score of a participant's graduation is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

Description

NA = Final Score TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 10. Leadership Achievement Pathway

- a. The test for leadership achievement selection consists of a written test and a skills test
- b. Written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The skills test material is a case study test related to leadership and organization
- d. The formula for the participant's final passing score is:

$$NA = 0.4 \times TS + 0.6 \times TK$$

NA = Final Value

TS = Written test score

TK = skill value

#### 11. Computer-Based Unesa Entrance Test Route (TMUBK)

- a. The test for the TMUBK selection route is a written test
- b. Written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. Specifically for sports and arts study options, additional points will be given according to the portfolio uploaded by the participant
- d. The formulation of the participant's final passing score is:

- 1) Sports and arts study programs that require a portfolio:

$$NA = 0.4*TS + 0.6*PT + 5*SPI \text{ Levels}$$

- 2) Non-portfolio study programs

$$NA = TS + 5*SPI \text{ Levels}$$

TS = written test score

PT = portfolio value

## 12. Disability Track

- a. The test for the Disability pathway selection consists of a written test and an interview
- b. Written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The interview test material is related to the participant's adaptation during lectures and the participant's ability to attend lectures according to the characteristics of the study program
- d. Participant graduation is determined by interview test recommendations and supported by written test results

## 13. Magetan Special TMUBK Route

- a. The test for the Magetan Special TMUBK route selection is a written test
- b. Written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. Specifically for sports and arts study options, additional points will be given according to the portfolio uploaded by the participant
- d. The formulation of the participant's final passing score is:

- 1) Sports and arts study programs that require a portfolio:

$$NA = 0.4xTS + 0.6xPT$$

- 2) Non-portfolio study programs

$$NA = TS$$

PT = portfolio value

## 14. Affirmation Path

The participant assessment materials and processes are adjusted to government (ministerial) policies

#### 15. Cooperation Pathway

- a. The test for the cooperation route selection consists of a written test and other tests according to the cooperation note
- b. Written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, Indonesian and English literacy tests
- c. The test assessment formula is adjusted to the memorandum of cooperation and agreement between Unesa and partners

#### 16. Overseas Route

- a. The overseas selection test consists of a written test and interview
- b. The written test material consists of scholastic tests, mathematical reasoning tests, and literacy tests
- c. The interview test material is an English language test for Indonesian students and/or an Indonesian language test for foreign students
- d. The formula for the participant's final passing score is:

$$NA = 0.5 \times TS + 0.6 \times W$$

Description

NA = Final Value

TS = Written test score

W = interview value

#### 17. Level Transfer Route

- a. The degree transfer applicant's diploma must match the chosen study program
- b. The tests for the transfer route selection are written tests and interviews
- c. The written test material consists of scholastic tests,
- d. The interview test material is motivation for changing levels and converting courses obtained at diploma level.
- e. The formula for the participant's final passing score is:

$$NA = 0.2 \times TS + 0.8 \times W$$

TS = Written test score

W = interview value

## **B. GRADUATION PROCESS**

After the assessment process is carried out, the chairman of the new student admissions committee together with the Unesa leadership hold a meeting to determine which students will be accepted as students. The process of determining graduation is carried out based on the assessment process that has been carried out.

## CHAPTER VI

### Single Tuition Fees /Institution Development Endowment

Single Tuition Fee (UKT) and Institutional Education Endowment (SPI) for each study program are determined through the Rector's Decree regarding the determination of UKT and SPI. The UKT and SPI for each study program are as in the guideline attachment.

#### B. CALCULATION AND DETERMINATION OF PROSPECTIVE STUDENTS' UKT

So that participants' UKT determination can be felt fairly, the UKT determination process is carried out by considering the economic capabilities of prospective students. The minimum UKT calculation is determined by calculating the salary of the prospective student's parents, the vehicle they own, and electricity payments. For prospective students from the national SNBP and SNBT route, the prospective student's UKT starts from UKT 1 to UKT 8. For prospective students who come from the Unesa independent route, the prospective student's UKT starts from UKT 5 to UKT 8.

### C. SPI DETERMINATION

Institutional Education Endowment (SPI) are only intended for prospective students who choose the independent route. Determining the SPI for prospective students is based on the SPI choice made through the [pmb.unesa.ac.id](http://pmb.unesa.ac.id) system. SPI payments can be paid in 2 installments in the first 2 semesters.

### D. FINANCING FOR ACHIEVEMENT TRACK STUDENTS

Financing for achievement pathway students consists of 4 financing scheme criteria. This financing scheme is based on the assessment results carried out and following the ranking order. The achievement pathway student financing scheme is as follows:

## **CHAPTER VII**

### **CONCLUSION**

The quality of higher education starts with student input. The better the input received, the easier and better the quality improvement. One of the initial student input processes is through new student admissions. Good admission of new students will facilitate the next quality improvement process. Therefore, new student admissions must be carried out fairly and wisely following their designation. One of the new student admission pathways at Surabaya State University is the independent pathway or better known as the SPMB pathway.

The process of admitting new SPMB students at Surabaya State University begins with the formation of a committee, where the formation of the committee is coordinated by the sub-directorate of student admission and graduation. Furthermore, the determination of the quota, the registration process, the test, and the announcement of new independent student admissions. The whole process is carried out through a digitized system through the [pmb.unesa.ac.id](http://pmb.unesa.ac.id) page. In general, there are 7 new student admission pathways at Surabaya State University, namely the SNBP/Raport Non-Test and UTBK Non-Test Pathways, Achievement Pathways, TMUBK Pathways, Disability Pathways, Affirmation Pathways, Cooperation Pathways, and Overseas Pathways.
