1. PURPOSE

Guidelines for the implementation of the remedial program to run in accordance with the provisions.

2. SCOPE

The scope of this procedure includes: the person in charge, general provisions, and a description of the remedial procedure.

4. DEFINITION

- 4.1. Remedial in the semester is a form of activity that is an improvement of student learning outcomes, by strengthening materials that have not been mastered by students and continued with retests.
- 4.2. Remedial participants in the semester are students who have studied and have not achieved minimal grades.

5. ACCOUNTABILITY

- 5.1. The Dean is responsible for monitoring the success of the student learning process.
- 5.2. The Vice Dean of academic affairs is responsible for ensuring the smooth implementation of the Remedial Program in semesters.
- 5.3. The Head of The Study Program is responsible for the implementation of the Remedial Program in semesters in each study program.
- 5.4. Lecturers of Course Master (DPMK) are responsible for remedial for students who have not completed the lecture material until midterm.

6. GENERAL TERMS

- 6.1. The implementation of the remedial program in the semester is held based on uts results.
- 6.2. Remedial program forms can be:
 - a. Relearning when more than 50% of students get a UTS score of less than 68 and resume re-exams.
 - b. Re-examine if any student gets a UTS score of less than 68.
- 6.3. Students are entitled to remidi opportunities by qualifying the criteria of six meetings, active, and doing tasks well.
- 6.4. Lecturers are obliged to provide remedial to eligible students at point 6.3.
- 6.5. The provision of UTS scores for students who follow remedial programs has alternatives:
 - a. UTS value is remidi result value
 - b. UTS value is the average before and after remidi
 - c. UTS value equals 68

7. PROCEDURE DESCRIPTION

- 5.1. DPMK conducts the lecture process and evaluation of learning as scheduled. UTS results become the basis of remedial implementation in the semester.
- 5.2. Remedial implementation in the semester is carried out after lecturers do UTS and retests are carried out no later than the 13th week.
- 5.3. Relearning is focused on a specific topic that has not been mastered by most students and is done outside of effective lecture hours.
- 5.4. Re-exams are also conducted outside of effective lecture hours.
