Note :

- 1. Learning Outcomes of Study Program Graduates (PLO-PRODI) are the abilities possessed by every graduate of the Study Program which are the internalization of attitudes, mastery of knowledge and skills in accordance with the level of study program obtained through the learning process.
- 2. The PLO that is charged to the course are several learning outcomes of study program graduates (PLO-PRODI) which are used for the formation/development of a course consisting of aspects of attitude, general skills, special skills and knowledge.
- 3. **CLO** is the ability that is specifically described from the PLO that is charged to the course, and is specific to the study material or learning material of the course.

- 4. **Sub-CLO (Final Ability)** is the ability that is described specifically from the CPMK that can be measured or observed and is the final ability that is planned at each learning stage, and is specific to the learning material of the course.
- 5. Indicators for assessing ability in the process and student learning outcomes are specific and measurable statements that identify the ability or performance of student learning outcomes accompanied by evidence.
- 6. Assessment Criteria are benchmarks used as measures or benchmarks for learning achievement in assessment based on predetermined indicators. The assessment criteria are guidelines for assessors so that the assessment is consistent and unbiased. Criteria can be either quantitative or qualitative.
- 7. Form of assessment: test and non-test.
- 8. Forms of learning: Lecture, Response, Tutorial, Seminar or equivalent, Practicum, Studio Practice, Workshop Practice, Field Practice, Research, Community Service and/or other equivalent forms of learning.
- 9. Learning Methods: Small Group Discussion, Role-Play & Simulation, Discovery Learning, Self-Directed Learning, Cooperative Learning, Collaborative Learning, Contextual Learning, Project Based Learning, and other equivalent methods.
- 10. Learning Materials are details or descriptions of study materials that can be presented in the form of several points and sub-topics.
- 11. The weight of the assessment is the percentage of assessment for each achievement of the sub-CPMK which is proportional to the level of difficulty of achieving the sub-CPMK, and the total is 100%.
- 12. TM=Face to Face, PT=Structured assignments, BM=Independent learning.
